About the College

Named apparently after Biswanath temple, one of the famous as well as oldest temples in the north-eastern part of India, Biswanath College has a heritage that goes back to more than 63 years, and it occupies a place among the premier seats of higher learning on the north bank of the river Brahmaputra. Located in an ideal setting, the College, grown from a humble beginning, is all set to realize its potential as a seat of academic excellence in the years to come. The College embarked upon its journey in 1960 when the north-eastern part of our country, former greater Assam, was considered to be a backward province in every sphere of life. But eminent scholar Sadananda Chaliha as long-serving principal with his keen interest in education took the College to newer heights of excellence. In the course of time the College has become a place of eminence in the realm of learning and academic proliferation.

Bounded by the river Borgang in the east, river Ghiladhari in the west, the Himalayas in the north and the river Brahmaputra in the south, Biswanath is one of the most important places in Assam in general, and in the district of Biswanath in particular if taken into account its historical significance. Having contributed significantly to the academic and cultural life of the north bank of the river Brahmaputra, Biswanath College has carved a niche for itself in the sphere of higher education in Assam. The college came into existence on 7th September, 1960 through the untiring efforts of the magnanimous people of the place in general, and of Naazibur Rahman, the then executive engineer in the PWD department, Assam, in particular. Now Biswanath Chariali (in the past the name of the place was just Biswanath) is one of the fast-growing cities in Assam.

Biswanath College is the brainchild of the socially conscious benevolent people of the locality with thirst for knowledge and strong desire for manifestation of education among masses. Their resourcefulness, sense of resilience and willpower were bolstered by a host of people of the locality who worked behind the scene with a mission at heart for this College. Biswanath College was brought under deficit system of grant-in-Aid by the Govt. of Assam on 01-04-63.

The science stream was introduced with the beginning of Pre-University classes under Gauhati University in the year 1970 with 46 students. Degree courses in science subjects started from 1976. The science section was brought under deficit system of grant-in-Aid on 01-01-78. The College was brought under provincialised system by Govt. of Assam in 2005.

Today the college has honours courses in 13rd subjects, a team of competent and committed teachers, a rich library and an environment conducive to teaching and learning. The College is planning to introduce different job-oriented vocational courses. The centre of Open and distant learning is offering under graduate and post graduate programmes under GUCDOE and KKHSOU. The Faculty of Commerce and Computer application were introduced in the College in 2012 and 2017 respectively.

The college has been accredited with 'B' grade by NAAC (National Assessment & Accreditation Council) during its third cycle of assessment and accreditation in March, 2022.

Introduction to FYUGP

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) of Gauhati University is as per UGC's Curricular Framework, published in November 2022. The course structure of FYUGP is built on the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS). Though, the FYUGP is basically a CBCS, it is radically different from the courses running under CBCS. Namely, it does not differentiate between so-called Honours and Pass courses existing under CBCS. Basically, the FYUGP is based on the system of education under Liberal Arts.

Salient features

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor's Degree programme under the CBCS is a 3-year degree programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science, or Commerce. One can also have a Bachelor's of Vocation degree, being run in some colleges, which in short form known as the BVoc degree. The two systems – Bachelor's Course under CBCS and Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP of NEP are different in the following ways.

• Duration

While under CBCS, one has a 3-year degree programme, under the NEP's FYUGP, it is a 4-year degree programme.

• Exits & Entries

In the FYUGP, one has choice to exit from the programme thrice – after one year, after two years, and after three years. If one exits the programme after one year, one gets a certificate. If one exits after two years, one gets a diploma. If one exits after three years, one gets a Bachelor's Degree. And finally if a student completes the whole 4-year, one gets a Bachelor's Degree (Honours). If you exit in the middle, the doors are still open for you to enter into the programme again and you can start the journey from where you left.

• Honours and Major

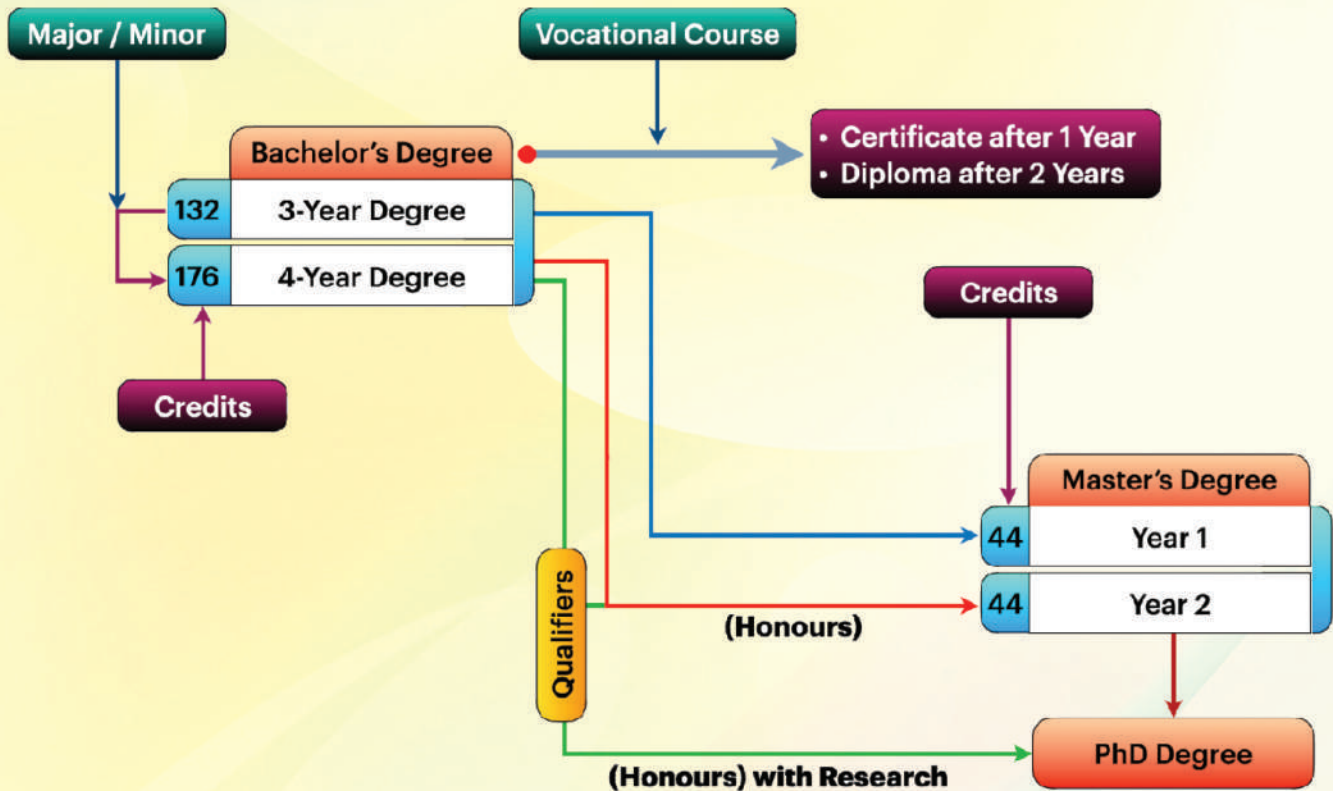
Under the CBCS, we either have Bachelor's Degree (Honours) or a regular Bachelor's Degree. In FYUGP, we get a Bachelor's Degree with Major after 3 years and a degree with Major & Honours after 4 year.

• Progression

If a student exits the FYUGP after 3 years, s/he will need to take admission into the first year of a Master's programme, which is a 2-year degree programme. However, if a student fully completes an FYUGP, s/he needs to take admission into the second year of a Master's programme and needs to complete only one year to get a Master's Degree.

• Progression to Doctoral Studies

Once a student takes admission into a Master's programme either after 3 years of the Bachelor's programme or after FYUGP, one will be able to take admission into a Doctoral programme leading to the Degree of PhD. However, if a student is exceptionally good, one can directly take admission into a Doctoral programme right after the FYUGP, bypassing the Master's programme.



FYUGP degrees & course structures

The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor's Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme—(i) Bachelor's Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline. The word stream here refers to Arts, Science, Commerce, and Management. In case of a degree in a stream, the student studies a multitude of different subjects, usually mixing different disciplines, which leads to a truly multidisciplinary degree. While in case of a degree in a discipline, the student is confined to a certain set of disciplines. However, in both cases, the student studies equal number of courses (i.e. papers) — so there is no weightage of any kind to either of the two types of degrees.

For both the types of degree programmes, course-wise, the whole FYUGP is divided into two parts — (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses. The minimum credit allocation for a 3-year programme is 84 credits in Core Courses and 36 credits in Common Courses, which comes to a total of minimum 120 credits for a 3-year programme. With the fourth year, the minimum credit requirements becomes 160. A student can however earn up to a maximum of 132 credits in a 3-year programme and 176 by the fourth year.

Core courses

The Core Courses determine the ultimate degree, diploma, or certificate a student will learn at the end of third (or fourth) year, second year, or first year, respectively. The performance in the Core Courses will also determine the grade of the student in the final examinations. Total minimum credit requirement is 84 for the Core Courses, which translates to 21 courses (i.e. papers) with a credit allocation of 4 per course (paper). A student will need to study at least three Core subjects.

The Core Courses have to be chosen among a plethora of subjects offered (see the section on Subject Details) for both the types of degrees, respectively. In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, the components of the Core Courses are Major and/or Minors, while in case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Discipline, there are no Majors and Minors.

Major and Minors

In case of a Bachelor's Degree in a Stream, a student either chooses a Major and Minors or just Minors from among the subjects. In any case, a student needs to complete 21 courses or 84 credits by the third year. Please see the examples that we have given in this booklet. A Major course MUST carry a minimum credit of 60 and a Minor course should carry a minimum credit of 12. Usually, for majority of the students, the Core Course will consist of one Major and two Minors.

Common courses

The common courses are to be studied by all students alike and altogether they carry a total credits of 36 over a 3-year period. These courses are further divided into five (5) sub-categories, as described below.

• Multi-disciplinary Courses

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects — (i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The level of these courses is of Class XII. Each student needs to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

A student CANNOT choose a multidisciplinary subject, if s/he has already studied that subject during Class XI-XII. Also the subject of these courses MUST not be among the Core Subjects the student has already chosen.

• Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)

This is an 8-credit course covering Modern Indian Languages (MIL) and English Usage (Communication). Each student needs to complete two papers of 4-credits each – one from English Usage and other from the group of MIL, especially designed for this purpose. Both these courses are further divided into two 2-credit courses each. The English Communication course is to be completed during Semesters 1-2 and the MIL course is to be completed during Semesters 5-6.

• Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)

These are various skill courses with total credit allocation of 9. All students need to complete three skill courses, each with 3 credits during Semesters 1-3.

• Value Added Courses (VAC)

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups — (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6.

Each student will have to take any three courses, each of 2-credit, from any three groups during Semesters 1, 2, & 4. Here one course from the Environmental Science group is compulsory except if the student takes a core course on Environmental Science.

• Internship

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

The fourth year

In the FYUGP, the fourth year is at par with the first year of a Master's programme, as a student can directly take admission into the second year of a Master's programme after the successful completion of the FYUGP. In the fourth year, a student has to complete one compulsory paper on Research Methodology (REM) in the Semester VII, which is a 4-credit theory paper. The rest of courses will consist of Advanced Core Courses and a Dissertation. The detailed structure for the fourth year will be published soon.

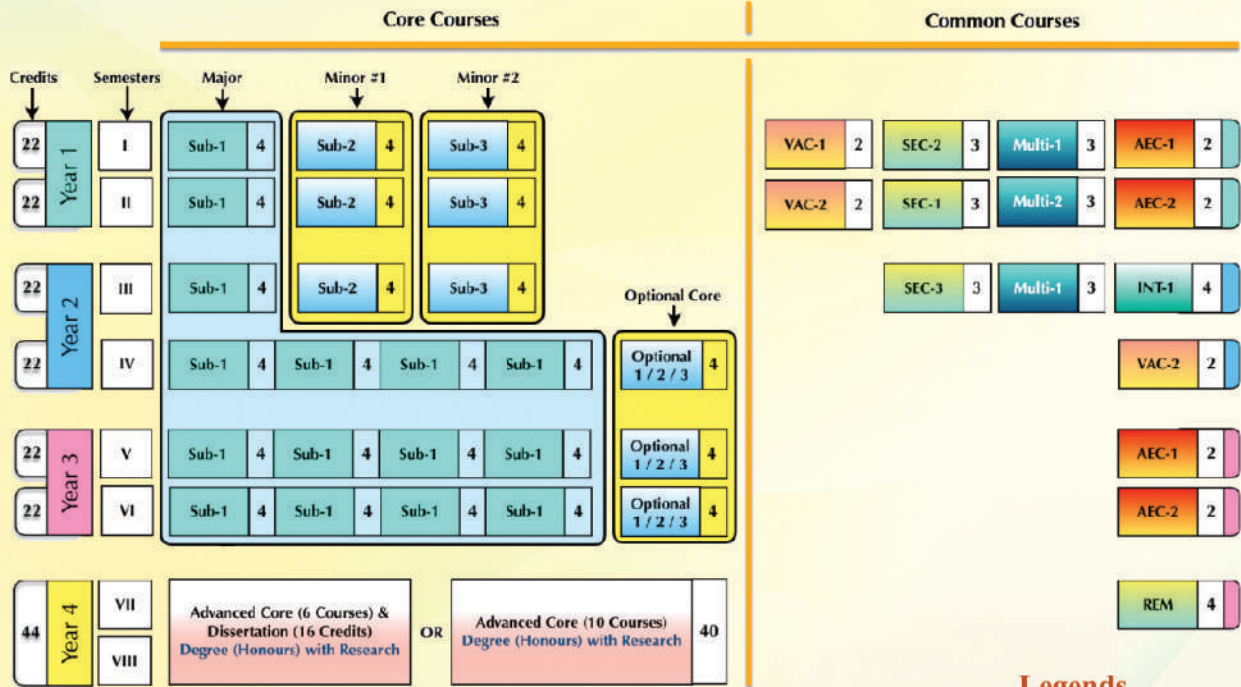

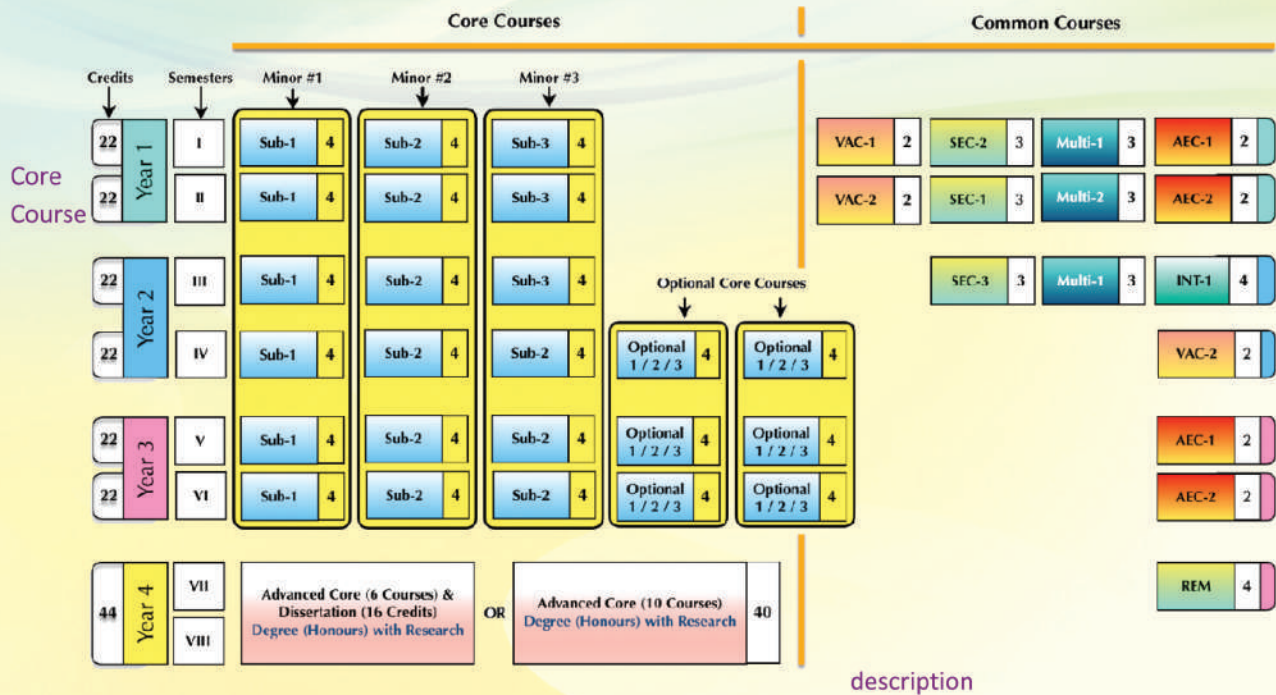
Core Course description

In this case, a student takes a Major subject with minimum 15 courses and two Minor subjects with a minimum of 3 courses each over a period of three years. Apart from these, the student also needs to take 3 Core courses during Semesters 4-6 where s/he can pick any of the three core subjects s/he has already studied.

In this case, a student takes a three Minor subjects each with a minimum 6 courses over a period of three years. A part from these, the student also needs to take 6 Core courses during Semesters 4-6 where/he can pick any of the three core subjects/he has already studied.

Examples

In these examples, we are providing two options a student can have. All the examples given below are for a 3-year degree programme. The fourth year can simply be added to the examples.

Example #1 – Degree with Major and Minors

In this example, we show the subject distribution for a Bachelor Degree in Arts with Major and two Minors. As one can see, there are 12 **Open Core Credits** to be earned by a student above the minimum requirement of 120 credits. These open core can be utilised for any of the following:

- For another Minor
- For one of the Minor so that it can be converted to a Double Major
- To complete course from the fourth year

In the figure below (Fig.4.1), the distribution is shown visually. The papers marked in **bold-red** denote that they are compulsory. One should note that the Internship can be done in any semester within the 3rd and the 6th. As an internship is always done during a break, it essentially *does not* interfere with the semester classes.

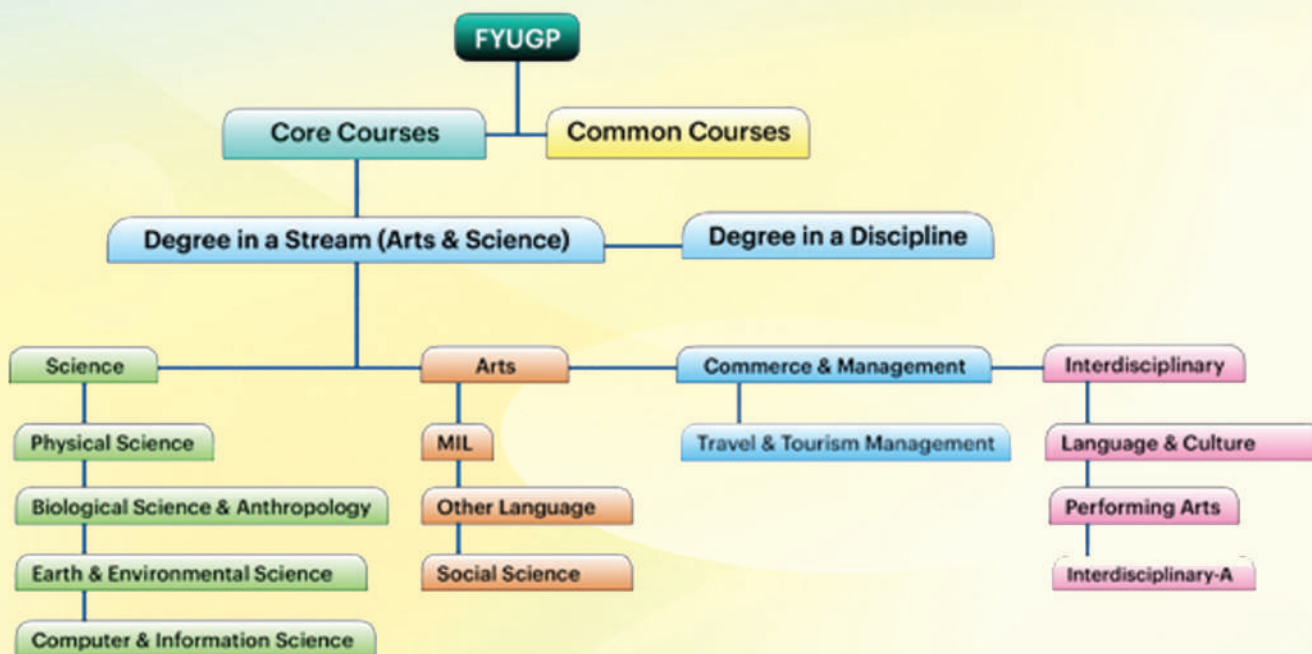
Figure 4.2: Example #2 – Degree with no Major.

Subject Details – Core Subjects

All these streams have their own subject groups. For example, Physical Science is a subject group of Science stream. Or, Other Language is a subject group of Arts stream. These groups with their parent streams are shown in Fig.



All the subject groups will have a bunch of individual subjects belonging to the respective groups, which will be described in the next section. The following applies to all these groups except the group for Commerce & Management.

- All groups have their own conditions and prerequisites.
- A student can combine any three subjects from these groups subject to the fulfillment of the requirements and prerequisites.

The three streams (a) Arts, (b) Science, and (c) Interdisciplinary—has their own subject groups. Each of these groups has their own constraints as to up to how many number of subjects from each subject-group can be chosen by a student.

Prerequisites, Requirements, & Constraints

The prerequisites are subjects that a student must have studied (and passed) in an earlier level of education (usually Class XI & XII) in order to be able to choose a subject. Essentially, all the levels of a subject have their prerequisites, which are spelled out very visibly in the cover page of a course syllabus.

In contrast to the prerequisites, requirements are certain conditions attached to some core subjects. For example, if a student wants to study Botany as a core subject, Chemistry as another core subjects has to be chosen. This is a 'requirement'. However, if one chooses Chemistry, there is no requirement.

Constraints refer to the maximum number of subjects a student can choose from a particular subject-group. For example, one can choose a maximum of any two subjects from the group Biological Science & Anthropology. This is a 'constraints' for this group.

The two year post graduate programme in Assamese was opened in 2018 and since then the college has admitted two batches of students.

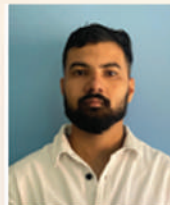

LIBRARY RULES :

- (a) The Library is open on all working days from 9-30 AM to 5-00 PM except on Sundays and authorised holidays.
- (b) The loan-counter will be closed half an hour before the closing of the library.
- (c) Students having General course may borrow two volumes and those having Major course four volumes of books at a time from the library.

HOSTEL FACILITIES

Hostel accommodation is provided to the students according to the availability of seats. At present there are two hostels for girls and one hostel for boys. In all there are 112 seats for girls and 15 seats for boys. While the Kanaklata Girls' Hostel is the oldest one, the Mulagabharu Girls' Hostel was constructed with financial assistance from UGC Xth plan period (2007-2012) and it accommodates 26 students. The Lachit Boys' Hostel was constructed during 2003-04 with financial assistance from the State Government.

The hostel boarders must abide by the hostel rules, copies of which are available with the Hostel Superintendent. Violation of hostel rules may lead to expulsion from the hostel or even from the college. The hostels shall remain closed during Summer and Puja Vacations. Boarders will be collectively responsible for the loss, impairment or destruction of any hostel property and they may be asked by the college authority to compensate for the loss collectively.

▣ OTHER ACADEMIC FACILITIES AVAILABLE IN THE COLLEGE :-

A. CAREER COUNSELLING & CAREER GUIDANCE CENTRE :

The college has set up a Career Counselling & Guidance Centre under a highly experienced and well-informed faculty member to help the students with proper guidance and career counselling. The centre has been organising seminars & workshops in the last several years with participation of prominent personality in the field and placement agency as Resource Person. Students of the college availing the opportunity have found placements in different depts and organisations including Defence. During this five year XIth plan this cell is financially strengthened by a good amount of grant from UGC, New Delhi.

B. Remedial classes for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer)/minority and economically backward students :-

The college, with financial assistance from University Grant Commission has introduced free remedial classes for SC/ST/OBC (non-creamy layer)/minority and economically backward students of BA/BSc. classes to enable them to compete with general students. Interested students may apply to the Course co-ordinator as and when admission to these classes start.

C. Free Coaching classes for entry into services for SC/ST/OBC (Non-creamy layer)/Minority/economically backward students :-

With financial assistance of University Grants Commission, Biswanath College has constituted a cell for giving free Coaching classes to students of SC/ST/Minority/OBC (Non-creamy Layer)/Economically backward category of BA/BSc classes in order to train them to sit for any interview either government or non-government. Interested students may apply for admission to such classes when admission to such classes starts.

D. In addition to regular academic courses the college offers facilities and opportunities for diversification propagation and exposition of inherent academic potential of students through different state level and national level competitive examinations as shown below :-

1. MATHEMATICS :

Department of Mathematics of the college is regularly holding two state level examinations.

i) Mathematics Competition and ii) Mathematics Olympiad. The examinations are conducted by Assam Academy of Mathematics, Gauhati University in the month of May and September every year. Many students from this centre have qualified for state level positions and also for Regional Mathematics Olympiad conducted by National Board of Higher Mathematics, Dept. of Atomic Energy, Govt. of India.

2. CHEMISTRY :

The Chemistry Department of the college regularly organises Chemistry Olympiad Examinations under Society for Chemical Education, Assam for students of Higher Secondary standard. This examination helps the successful students to participate in the National Standards Examination (NSE) in Chemistry conducted by Association of Chemistry Teachers.

3. PHYSICS :

National level competitive Examinations in Physics are organised in our college by Dept. of Physics.

The examinations are :-

- i) National Standard Examinations in Physics (For H.S. Students)
- ii) National Graduate Physics Examinations (For Degree Students)

▣ Career Oriented Programme :

A. Tea Husbandry :

During the 10th UGC plan period a Career Oriented Programme in Tea Husbandry was started in the college. During the current UGC plan, the UGC has sanctioned the BVoc course for this college. Under this scheme, a six-month certificate course in Tea Husbandry (Tea Plantation & Management) has been introduced in the college. It is hoped that the course will help the students in securing lucrative placement.

B. Certificate course in Functional English :

The Department of English offers a six-month certificate course in Functional English to the undergraduate students at a nominal cost. The course will enable the students to acquire the four skills of language which is now essential in every step of life. The students are trained through CALL (Computer Assisted Language Lab). Interested students may contact the Head of the Department of English of this college.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS AND GENERAL RULES

1. Photo-copies of self-attested marksheets are to be submitted with the Admission Form. But the original testimonials must be produced at the time of interview for admission.
2. In the case of Break of studies, the 'Gap Certificate' from a magistrate verifying character and stating the reasons of inability for prosecuting studies during the gap period must be submitted with the Application Form for admission.
3. Selection of the students for admission is normally done on the basis of the results of the last examination passed. The policy of the reservation of seats is strictly accordance with the Govt.norms.
4. If selected, admission must be taken on the specified day.
5. If any candidate fails to be present on the admission day owing to unavoidable reasons, his/her guardian/ representative may take the admission, producing all the original testimonials. Otherwise, no claim for admission will be entertained later on.
6. Fees mentioned in the prospectus are subject to revision from time to time.
7. A Guardian's declaration authorising the college authority to take action against his/her ward if he/ she violates the Rules and Regulations of the College must be enclosed in the application form for admission.
8. The student seeking admission from the other states or universities must submit Migration certificate within 3 (three) months from the date of their admission.
9. The students are to note that as per Gauhati University norms a student is to attend 75% of classes held in a session to be eligible to appear at University Examinations.
10. The students once getting admission into the college must strictly adhere to the rules of the college regarding the College-uniform so as prevent entrance of outsiders into the College campus during college hours.
11. Students indiscipline in terms of ragging, teasing, misbehaving fellow-students or teachers is strictly prohibited.
12. Active participation of all the students in academic enterprises like Seminars, Talks, Debate and Discourses, Symposium etc.is mandatory.
13. Participation of all students in co-curricular activities of the College is compulsory.
14. Smoking and use of alcohol & drugs within the College campus are strictly prohibited.
15. Movements of vehicles within the College campus during the class hours are prohibited so as to maintain peace and discipline in all respects.
16. Prior permission from the Principal must be obtained for holding all kinds of meetings or assemblage within the College campus so that the smooth functioning of the classes or office works may not be affected.
17. It is compulsory for all students to sit for all Departmental, Terminal, Test, Annual Examinations of the college. Medical certificates are not entertained for promotion.
18. Hostel facilities are available for female students only and seats are allotted to the applicants on merit basis only.
19. Computer facility is also available for the students, if they genuinely seek for.
20. Use of mobile phone inside the College campus strictly prohibited.

ATTENDANCE RULES

Students not attending at least 75% of classes shall not be allowed to appear in the examination conducted by AHSEC/ Gauhati University.

- Certificate in support of EWS (Economically weaker sections)
- Income Certificate issued by Circle Officer only.

GENERAL RULES FOR MAINTENANCE OF DISCIPLINE AMONG STUDENTS

- The college is committed to maintenance of discipline and decorum among students.
- Students must abide by all rules and regulations as prescribed by the college authorities. Violations of rules, irregular attendance, irregular clearance of hostel dues, showing discourtesy to teacher and staff members in any forms, adoption of unfair means during examination, delinquent behaviour in the college campus or outside etc. are some of the offences which may invite disciplinary action like termination of scholarship, forced transfer and even expulsion from the college and the hostel.
- All forms of ragging in hostel or college campus are prohibited. Strong disciplinary action will be taken if one is found to be involved directly or indirectly in ragging.
- Any notice desired to be pasted or circulated by the students anywhere in the college and hostel premises will need the prior permission of the college authority.
- Powers in respect to maintenance of discipline are vested with the Head of the institution. His decision shall be final in all such matters.

RAGGING

As defined by Honourable Supreme Court of India, any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other students, indulging in rowdy or indiscipline activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or Psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such students will not be in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely effect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student is defined as ragging.

ANY SENIOR STUDENT FOUND INDULGING IN RAGGING INSIDE THE COLLEGE CAMPUS/ HOSTEL SHALL BE PUNISHED AS PER ORDER OF SUPREME COURT OF INDIA.

OTHER INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES AND COCURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

GIRLS' COMMON ROOM :
